Budget Outlook

- We are experiencing a more positive economic outlook than we have actually seen since 2008
- We continue to remain financially stable and have acceptable reserve funds
- We will continue to have a very low county tax rate

Proposed Budget

Public Notices/Posting Requirements

- Public Hearing Notice for the Proposed Budget was advertised in the Denton Record Chronicle according to the provisions in the Local Government Code on August 17th
- Public Hearing Notice for the Proposed Budget was posted on the main page of the Denton County web-site
- A copy of the Proposed Budget was filed with the County Clerk, County Auditor and Budget Office on August 26th
- The Proposed Budget was posted on the Denton County web-site on August 26th for public inspection and review

Initial Budget Requests

Summary of Tax Levies & Projected Fund Balances

- Initial Requests totaled \$262.8 million
- Increase of \$23.9 million
- Tax Rate of \$0.273693 would be required
- 7.33% tax rate increase would have been required

Adopted Budget FY 2016

- FY2015 Budget = \$238,912,256
- Adopted Budget = \$254,890,520
- Adopted Increase = \$ 15,978,264

Adopted Budget FY 2016

- The County Budget is divided into 23 separate funds
- 6 are partially funded with property taxes
 - General Fund
 - Juvenile Probation
 - Indigent Care
 - Road and Bridge
 - Public Health
 - Debt Service
- The remaining 17 are funded through special revenue or user fees.

Effective Tax Rate

- The effective tax rate will provide the taxing unit with approximately the same amount of revenue it had the year before on properties taxed in both years.

EXHIBIT 1: Calculating the Effective Tax Rate

$$\left[\begin{array}{c} \text{Prior Year's Taxes} \\ \text{Less} \\ \text{Taxes on Property Lost This Year} \\ \hline \text{(divided by)} \\ \hline \text{Current Value of Property} \\ \text{Taxed in the Prior Year} \end{array} \right] \times \$100$$

Generally, if values increase, the effective tax rate goes down; if values decrease, the effective tax rate goes up.

New Property Value

- New property value generates new revenue for a taxing unit. This helps offset property value losses for new exemptions and special appraisals granted for the first time in the current year.
- The taxing unit deducts new property value from the appraised values in the effective tax rate calculation
- New Property values total \$7,050,033 in new funds used in the adopted FY2016 budget, an increase of \$2.1 million.

Summary of Current and Adopted County Tax Rate

- Current Tax Rate = \$0.272200
- Effective Tax Rate = \$0.255866
- Rollback Tax Rate = \$0.270034
- **Adopted Tax Rate = \$0.262000**
- Variance (Current vs. Adopted) = (\$0.010200)
- Variance (Effective vs. Adopted) = \$0.006134

The Adopted Tax Rate is **2.4%** above the effective tax rate.

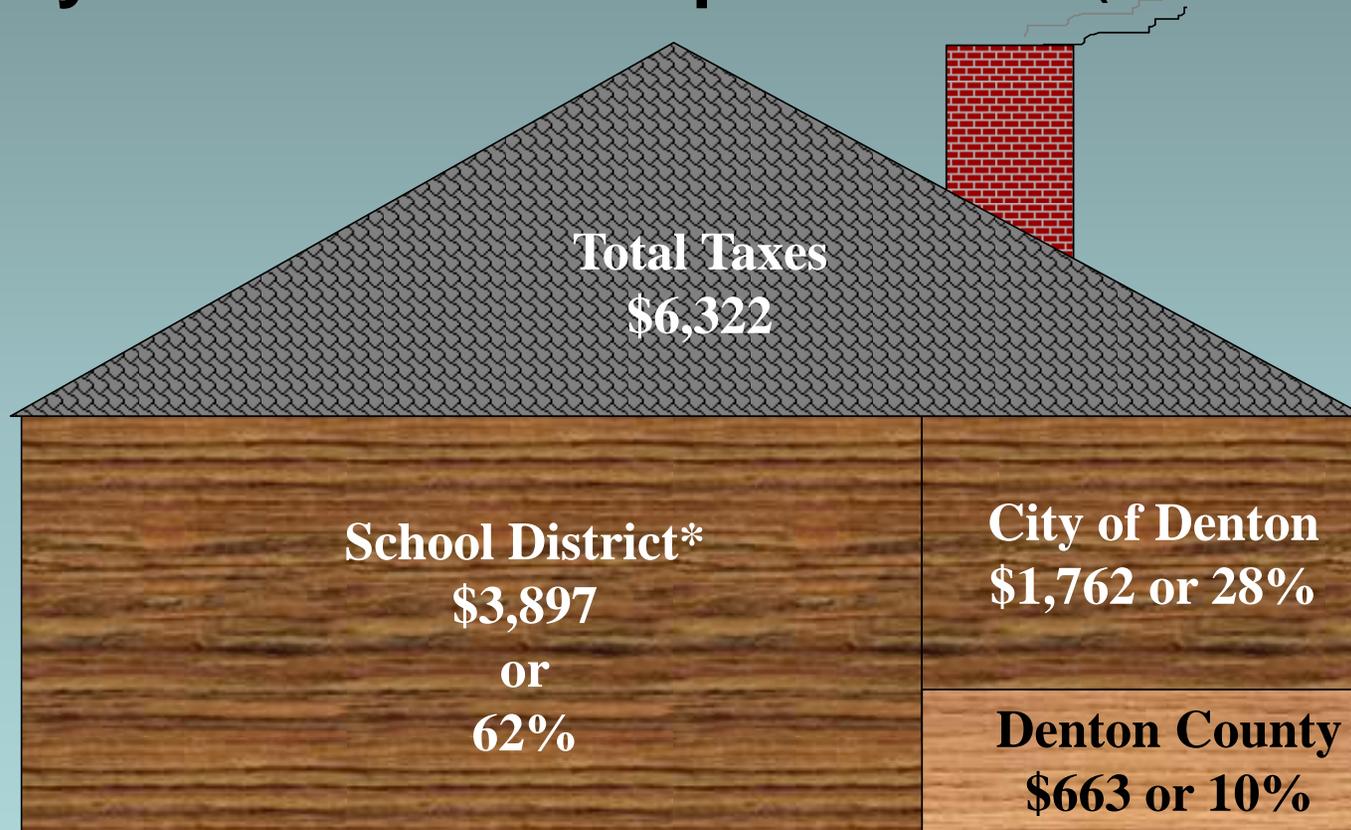

City of Denton – Adopted Rates (Tax Year 2015)



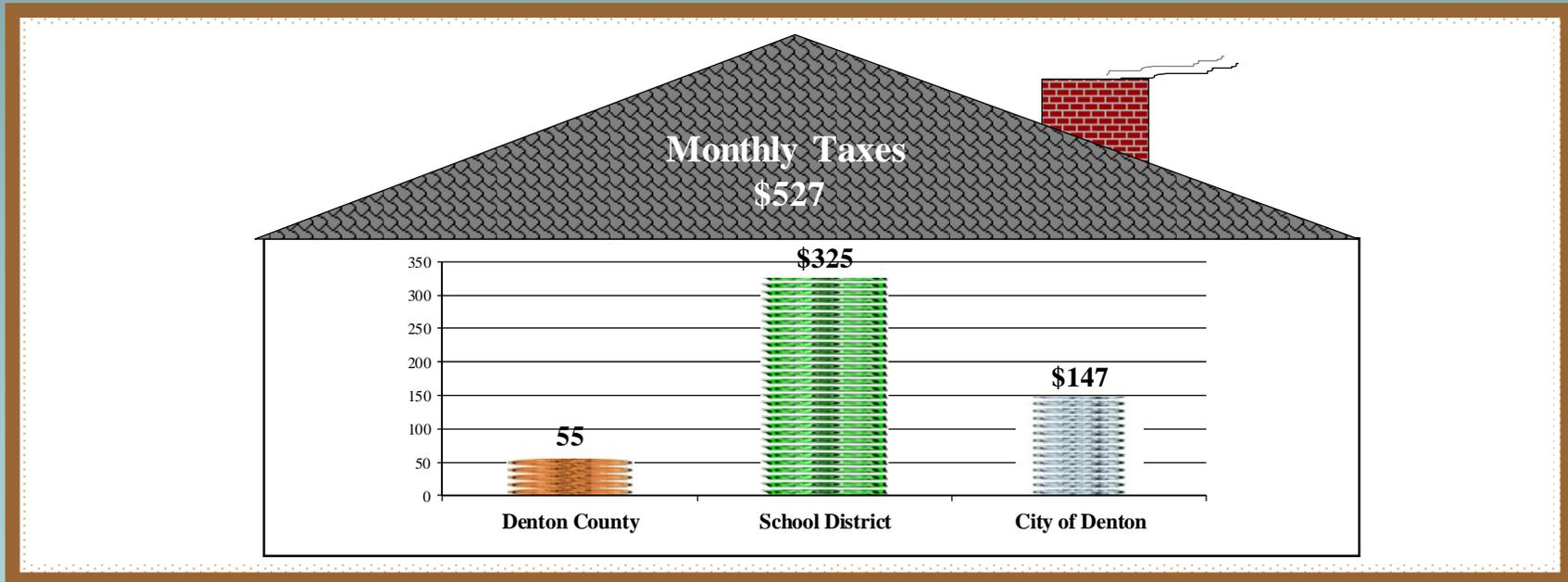

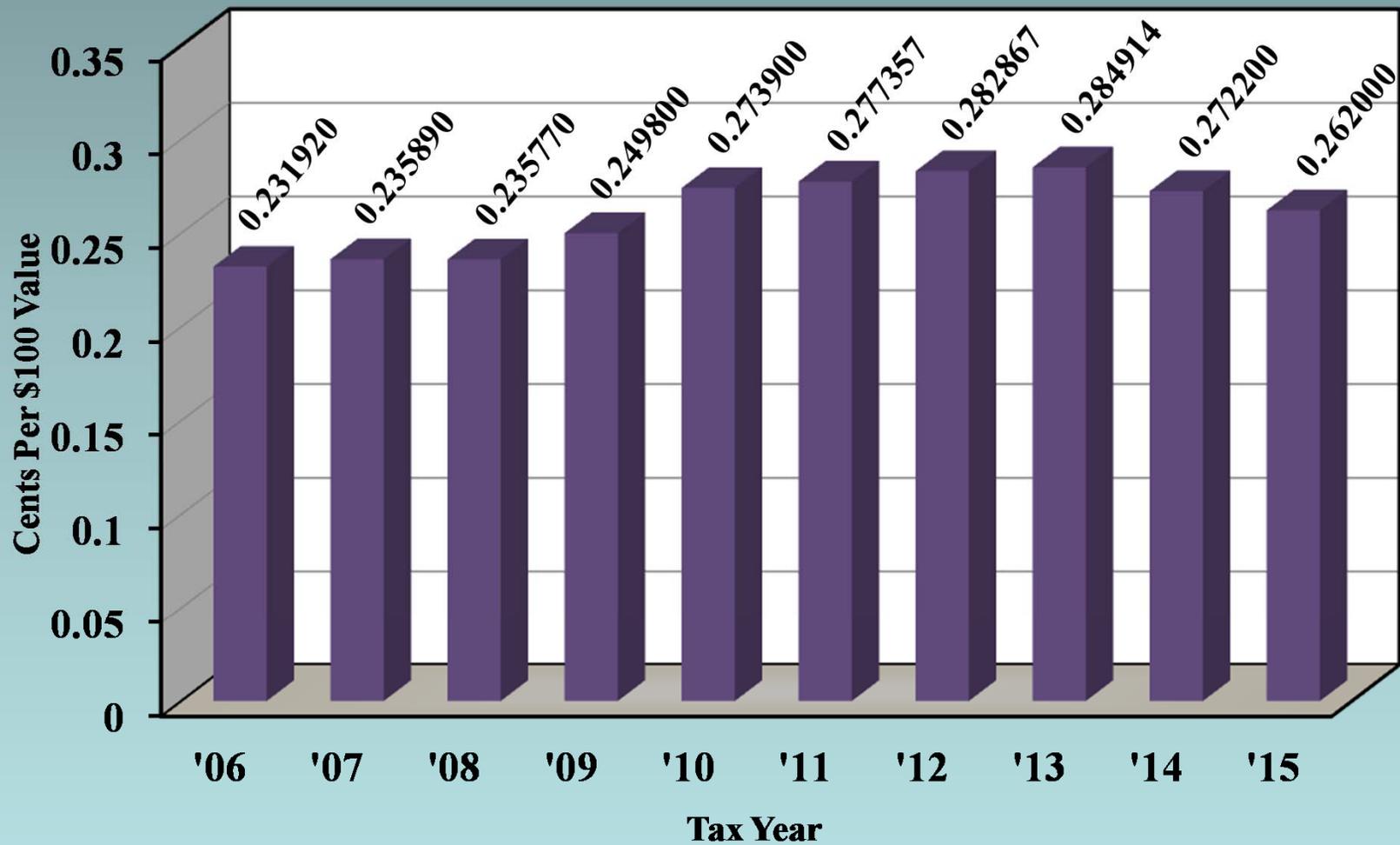

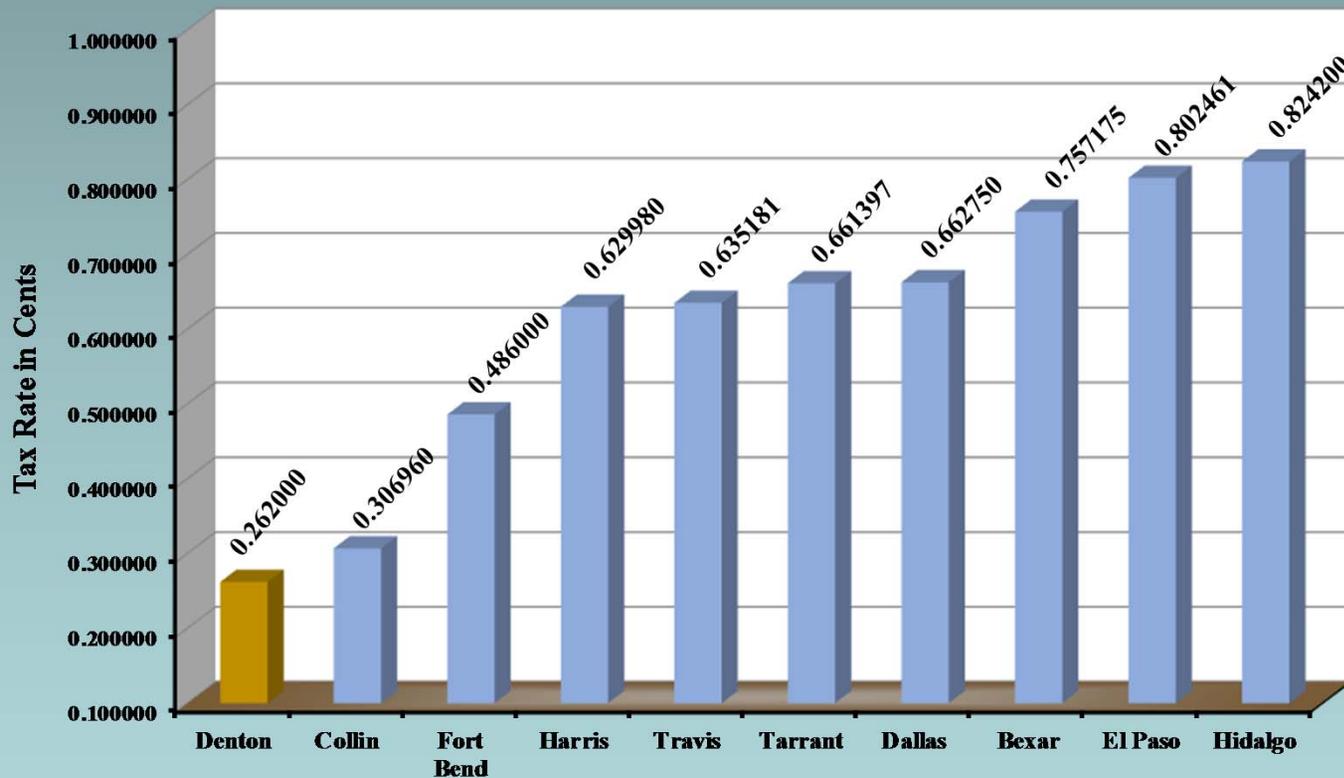

Comparison of Top 10 Texas Counties Combined County-Wide Tax Rates

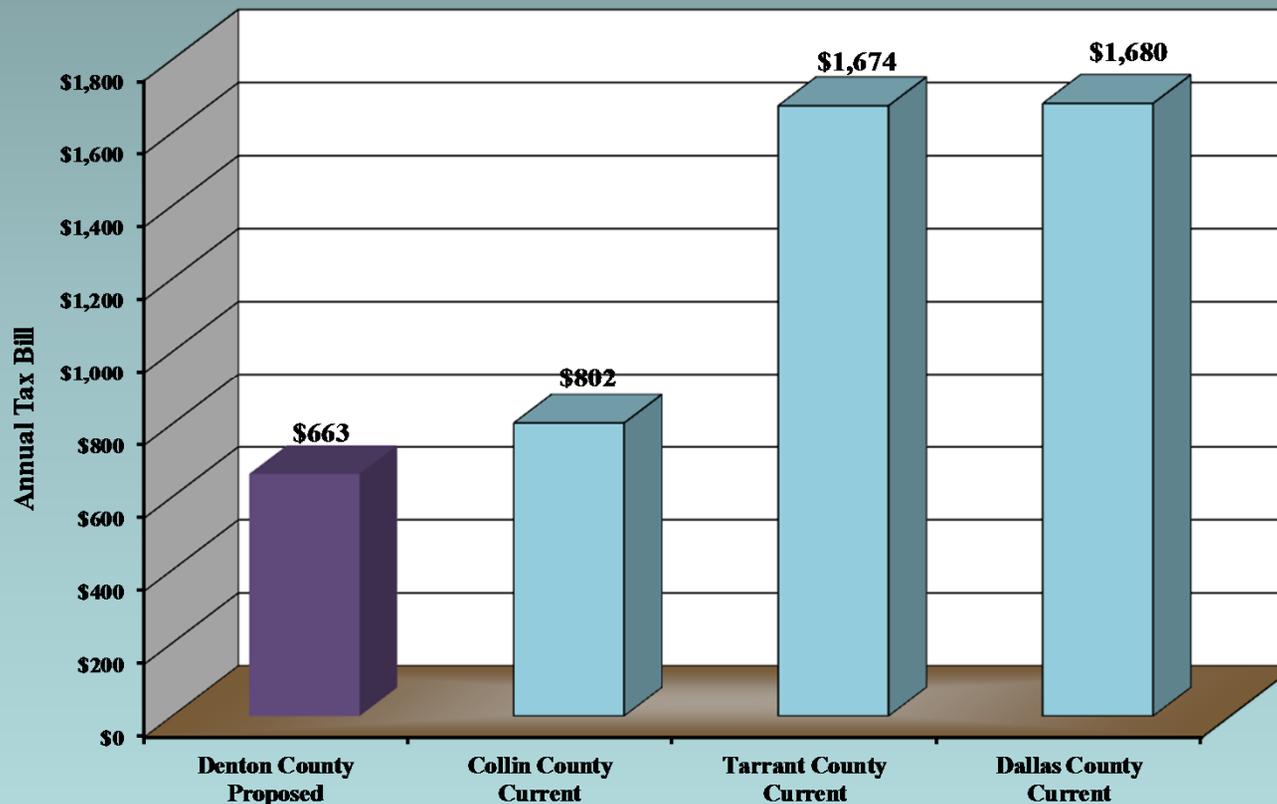


Denton County tax rate is the proposed rate for FY16. Other counties tax rates are the existing FY15 rates.

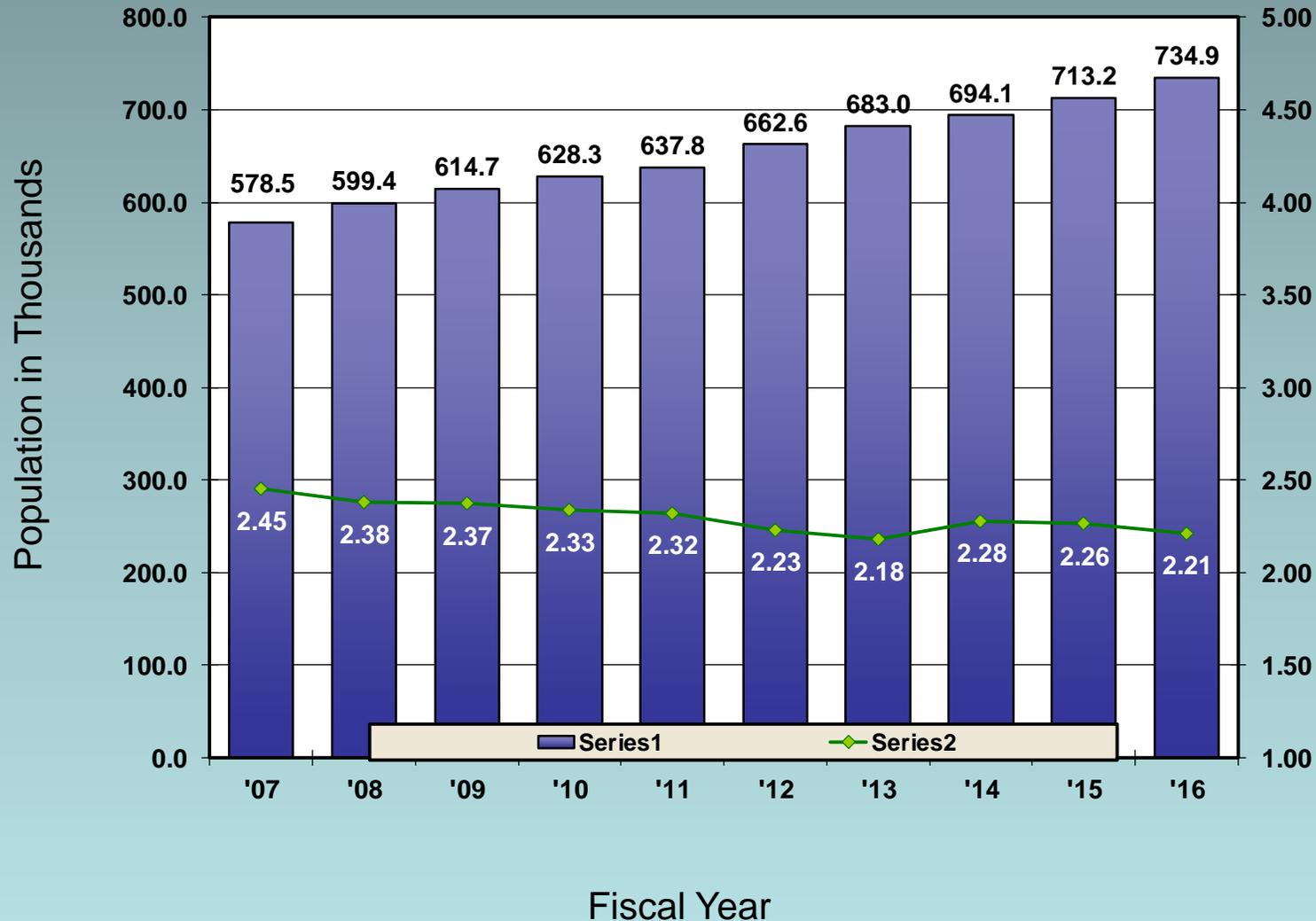

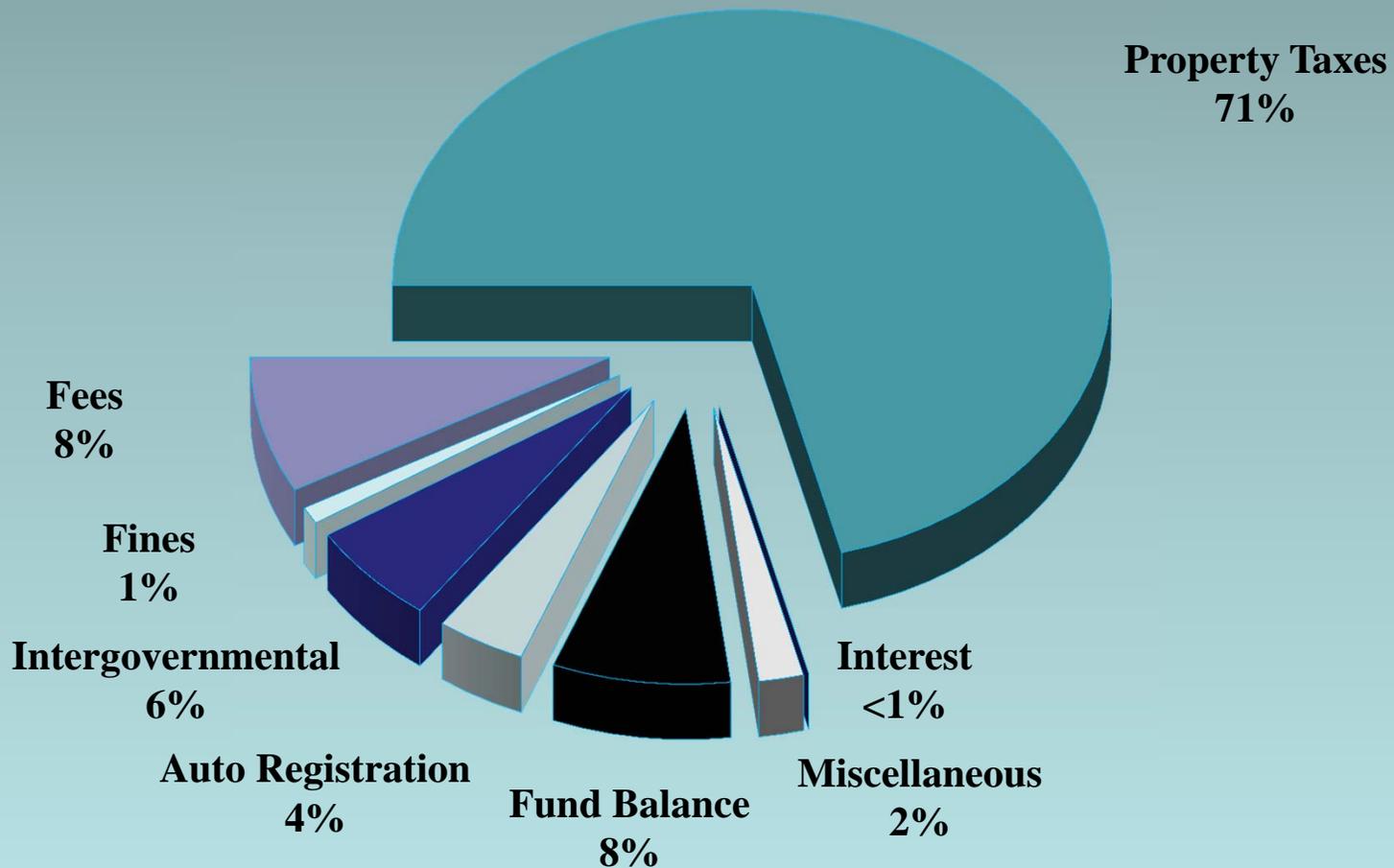

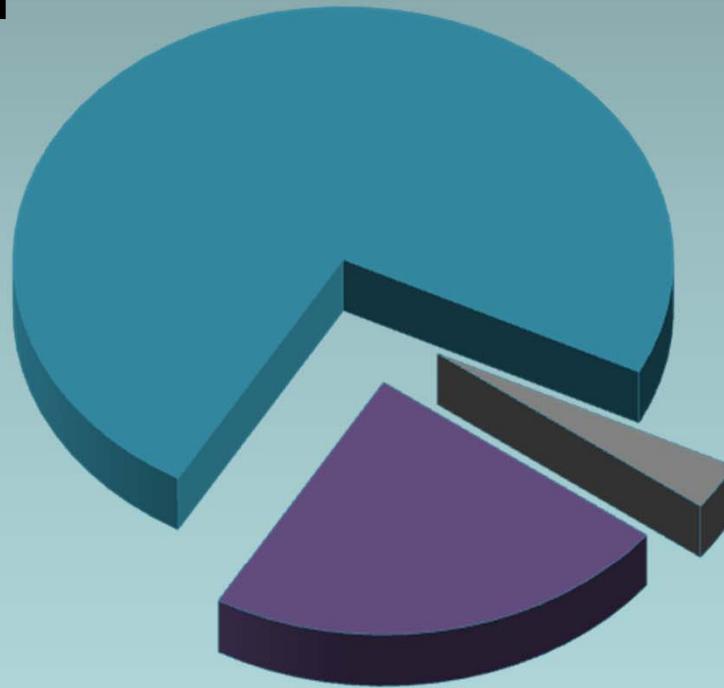

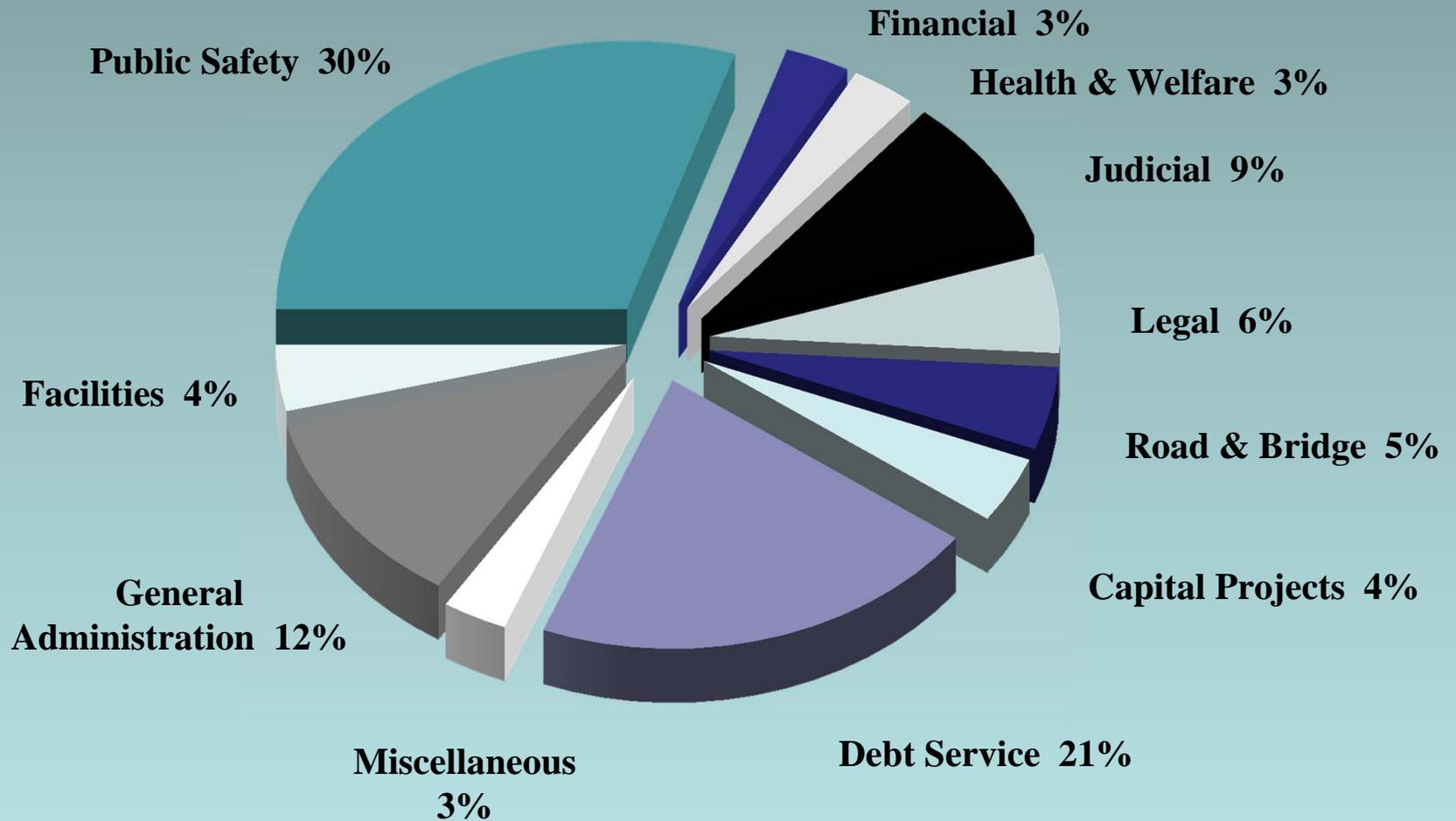

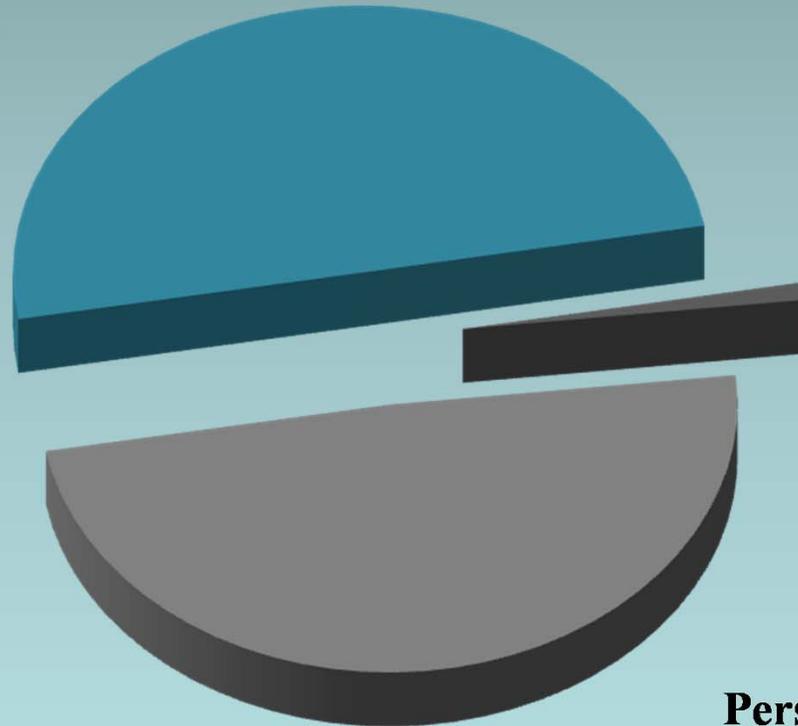

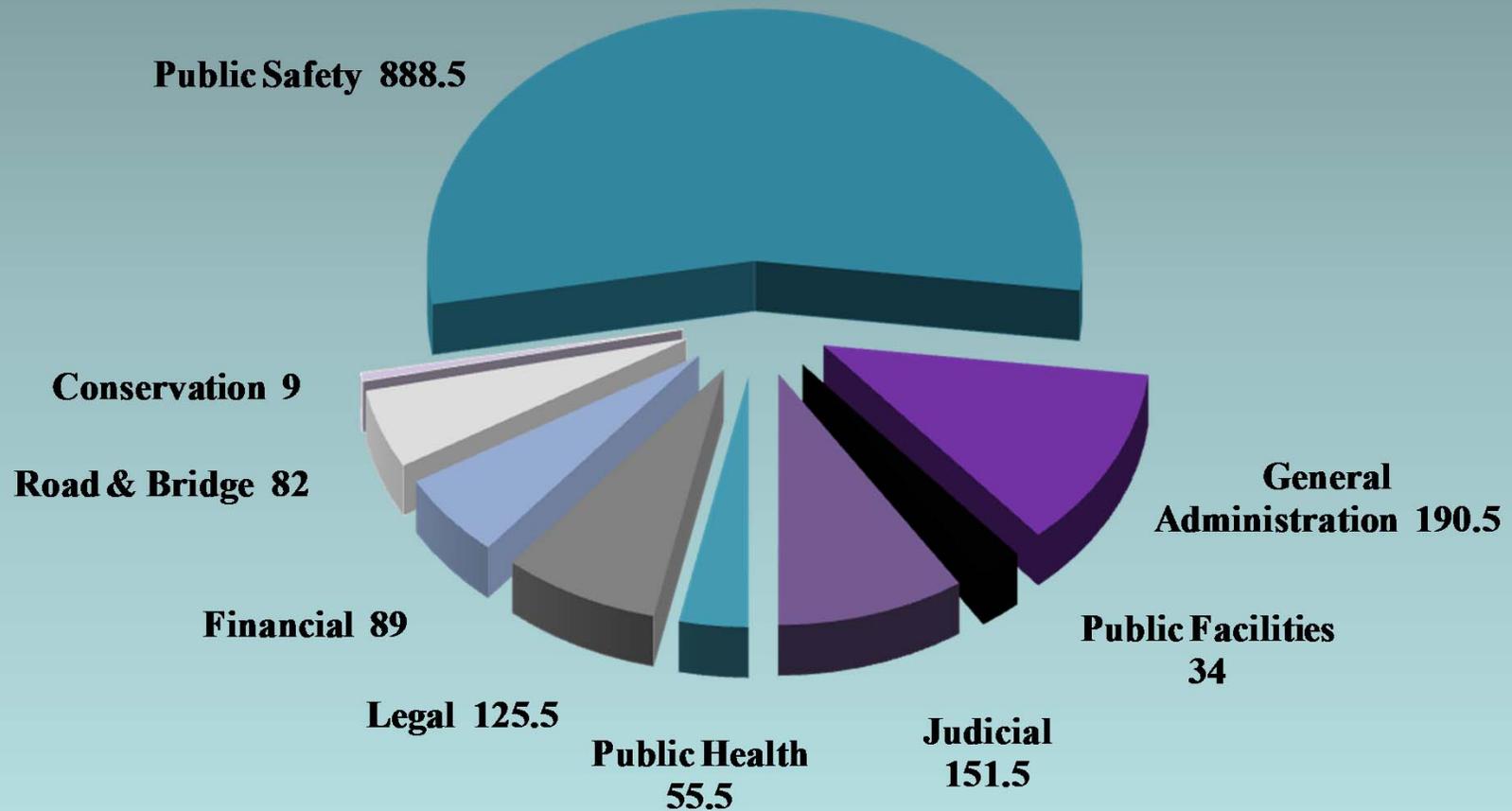

What Does Bond Rating Mean?

- This is a grade assigned by private rating services such as Standard & Poor's and Moody's where they evaluate a bond issuer's financial strength, or its ability to pay principal and interest in a timely fashion.
- Bond ratings are expressed with letters ranging from AAA, which is the highest rating to a C, which is the lowest rating.

“The stable outlook reflects the county's stable economy and conservative budgeting which will enable it to maintain solid financial performance and reserves.”

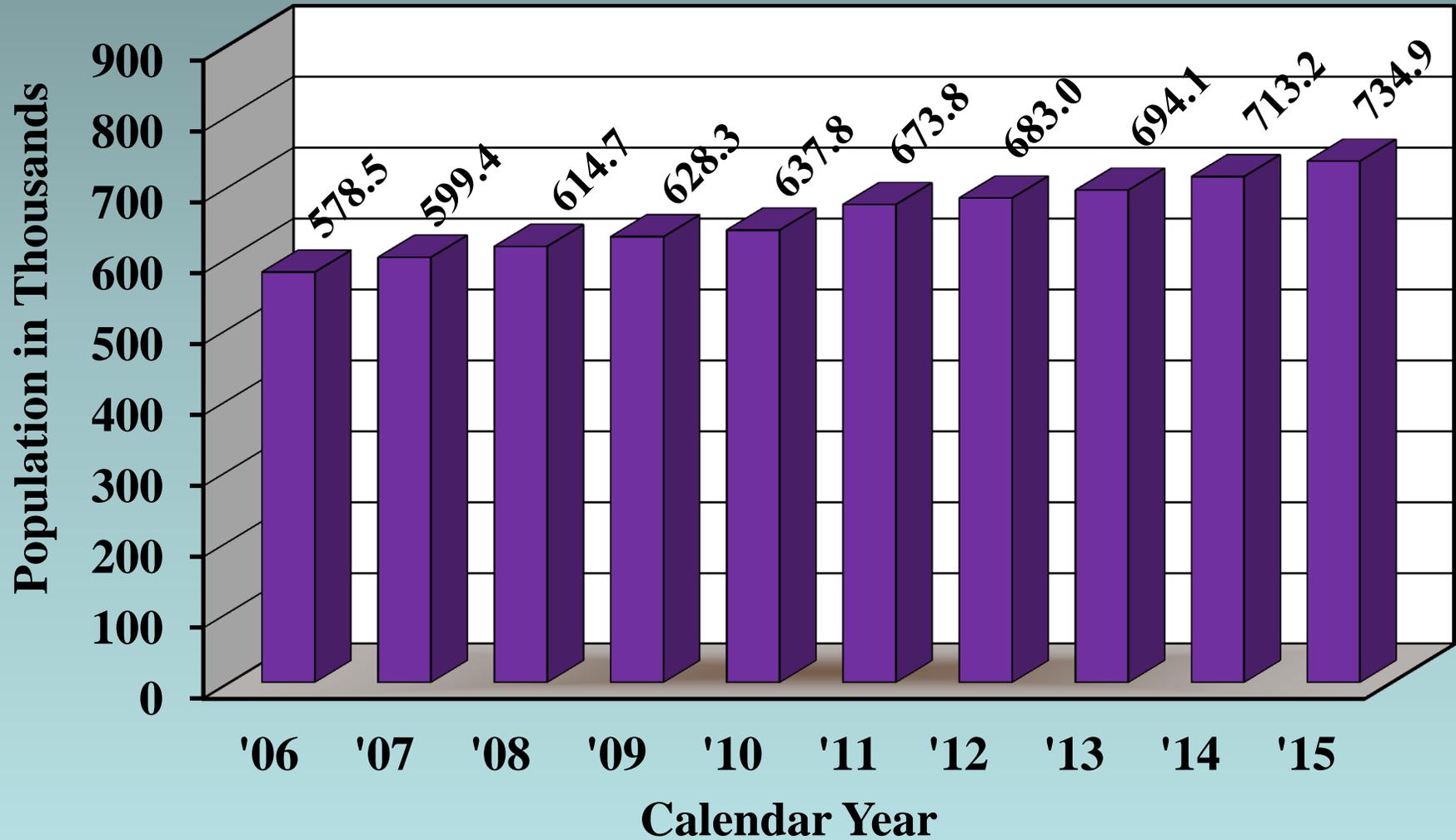
Standard & Poor's – AAA

“The stable outlook reflects our expectation that the county will continue to benefit from its location in the Dallas-Fort Worth-Arlington MSA, allowing for continued property tax base growth. The outlook also reflects an expectation that the county will maintain its very strong budgetary flexibility and strong budgetary performance.”

Denton County's Bond Rating

- The fact that Denton County has the highest possible credit score given to governments, is a testament to the prudent financial management of the County.

Adopted Budget Overview

- Sound financial plan for the county
- Preserves high quality services
- Rewards employees for their continued hard work and dedication by including various reclassifications, a market adjustment and merit increase for eligible employees
- Provides for sufficient reserve funds
- Minimal tax increase above the effective tax rate is for voter approved road/technology projects approved by the voters and other mandatory increases
- Includes reduced expenses when feasible
