Culvert Process Instructions

1. The Property Owner is responsible for placing a stake to mark the proposed locations of the culvert.
2. Once the proposed location is marked, the Property Owner/Contractor is responsible for notifying the Road and Bridge Division so the location can be researched and the design of the culverts and/or processing of approved subdivision plans can proceed. Culvert and/or safety ends are not allowed to cross property lines.
3. Within 10 working days of this notification, the Denton County Road and Bridge Division shall provide the Property Owner with the size and number of culverts to be installed and shall place grade stakes at the culvert ends. It is the responsibility of the Property Owner to insure that his or her contractor install the culvert at those grades. Any culvert not placed in accordance with the required grades will be removed and the applicant will be required to reinstall at their own expense.
4. All culverts shall be galvanized corrugated steel only. The length shall in no case be less than 20 feet or more than 60 feet (not inclusive of the length of the safety ends).
5. The owner must call for inspections during the following stages of the culvert installation process:
 - a. After the culvert is set at the grades shown on the fields stakes **PRIOR** to covering the culvert.
 - b. After the culvert safety ends (4:1 sloped ends) have been formed and are ready for inspection (form work and reinforcing steel are complete) per the County specifications and the backfill has been placed.
 - c. After the culvert and safety ends are complete with all concrete poured, the site cleaned of form work and debris, and all **compacted** backfill is in place.
6. All inspections must be called in at least 48 hours in advance. Grade stakes will be set one time per application. Should the stakes be disturbed prior to installation, cut specifications will be given.
7. Development Permits will not be issued until the final inspection has been approved by the Road and Bridge Division.
8. Any modifications to the driveway/culvert after the permit has been approved and installation accepted will not be allowed and the Property Owner may be required to remove and replace the driveway/culvert at their own expense.
